
- Allowed all Stakeholders to review each Design Submittal and Binders in Real-Time making the review process fast and efficient.

- The Color Sheet Comparison Module verified to the stakeholders that the comments from the previous Design Submittal were indeed picked up.







 The current set allowed all stakeholders to do their work without having to search for related information to the plan set. i.e. linked details and rfi's to the specified sheet.




RED ZONE READY

The PIM started day one to assemble the Red Zone deliverables and to vault the information as the project proceeded.


The turnover of the information was done as the Contractor was leaving the site thus allowing the Facility Director use of the data day one.


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"Why, with this KTR is the project running so smoothly? As I said at our out brief on site, I don't mind spreading the accolades around between the resident COR, USACE Quality Assurance (QA), base Facility Manger (FM), DHA Health Facility Officer (HFO) and KTR team, but there is another component not yet mentioned; MSP has created visibility where there has not been in the past, especially for DHA. Because MSP audits, organizes and presents project information in one location, the project is saving time and money. I did not say this at the out brief, but MSP has also held the KTR accountable. Because MSPs takes part in the Project Delivery Team (PDT) meetings and reviews the minutes before posting them on their dashboard, they have been able to catch incorrect or omitted information by the KTR. Additionally, because MSP manages the Supplemental Information (SI) review/comment sessions, similar to ProjNet, MSP has contacted me before simply following the request of the KTR to reopen a comment session. These are two examples I'm aware of, but there are probably more."

Statement of Gerald T. Keenan President, NJ Alliance for Action Meeting of the Board of Commissioners Gateway Development Commission August 28th, 2024

Co-Chairs Grewal-Virk and Glen, and Commissioners of the Gateway Development Commission, along with CEO Kolluri, thank you for the opportunity to offer comments to you this morning on behalf of the New Jersey Alliance for Action.

I'm Jerry Keenan, President of the New Jersey Alliance for Action. As the members of this commission know, the Alliance is a non-partisan and non-profit association representing thousands of business, labor, government, utility, education, professional and other New Jersey leaders. Our mission is to improve New Jersey's economy through the promotion of environmentally friendly capital construction and infrastructure investment.

Hearty congratulations to the Commission this morning as you prepare to execute yet another crucial step in the development of the Gateway Project: Entering into the Final Agreement with the Federal Railroad Commission that will enable this project to receive \$3.8 billion in funding for the Hudson River Tunnel Project. Also, this funding is part of an overall \$12.88 billion in funding for Gateway. That is over 79% of the total cost of the project.

Such federal funding is unprecedented. But necessary, as this is the most important infrastructure project in our nation; bar none!

This project will reverberate through our economy. Not only while it is being built and the 95,000 jobs that are going to be generated during that period. But it will continue to make an impact throughout its lifetime of operation.

Today, another important milestone is being realized for a project that will benefit us well into the 22nd Century. Congratulations to the Commission for bringing together an historic collaboration between New Jersey, New York, the federal government and all the transportation partners involved.
